

This book is a good combination of conductors who have had real life experience. Rehearsing the band is a good book with ideas that can be incorporated into a band class. However, many of the concepts are for high school bands. I just cannot see using a lot of these ideas with a middle school band.

This book is chock full of observations and conversations with extremely knowledgeable Band Directors. Almost all of the chapters say the same thing: tone, intonation,rhythm,etc., but instead of being repetitive it comes across as emphasis... Keep the most important thing, the most important thing. Rather than a collection of techniques to use, it is a fine tuning of how one should think on the podium. A good book to help focus your approach.
